



WENGER HERITAGE

A legend of Swiss Army knife heritage is reborn

Wenger has drawn on its heritage to produce a replica of the first Swiss Army Knife produced by Wenger in 1901.

The prototype for all subsequent versions of the now ubiquitous multifunctional Swiss Army knife, this model was the first knife ordered by the Swiss Army.

1893 of the limited edition replica have been produced, for the year that Wenger was first founded, with only 8 of the blades set to land in Australia.

The knife, crafted, assembled and adjusted manually in the Wenger workshop, is true to the original blueprints, with each individually numbered model coming complete with a copy of the technical drawings, preserved for over 100 years in Delémont. Each model also comes with a certificate of authenticity.

The original blueprints, which could be considered the birth certificate of the grandfather of the Swiss Army knife, are dated January 1891, and bear the official stamp of the Swiss Federal Munitions Administration.

The only differences from the original version are the non-corroding stainless steel used, and a slightly rounder cam, for easier opening.

The knife comes equipped with a blade, screwdriver, awl, and can opener. The set is contained in a display case made of wood and leather, inspired by army trunks circa 1900.

Emblazoned with the Swiss escutcheon, the Wenger Heritage is the embodiment of the history of a Swiss legend, which has been exported to all four corners of the globe, and even into space—the multifunctional pocketknife.
